We prepare children for the opportunities of a global modern world. Each pupil has an iPad providing extensive resources in digital learning, communication, and presentation skills. Our phone-free school has strengthened our efforts to teach positive digital habits.

As a one campus school, spanning Junior 1 to Senior 6, pupils enjoy smooth transitions, and small class sizes allow each child to be known by staff and receive the support, challenge and guidance they require according to age, aptitude and ability. Our Junior School

Our Juniors experience a broad and exciting curriculum within a nurturing environment, that focuses on supporting each pupil to achieve their potential.



Home Rooms and mornings

Each morning, our Juniors meet in their Home Rooms to settle and prepare for the day, before they break into smaller numeracy and literacy groups. Our Learning support specialists ensure that every pupil is challenged and supported to make progress at their own pace.



Afternoons

In the afternoons, Junior 1 - 7 continue with their broad curricular experiences including French, Drama, Science, Social Studies, Discovery, RME, Health and Wellbeing, PE, and Technology. We use our Discovery Room for artistic projects, for larger group creative lessons, Big Art Afternoons, and for learning through play.



Discovery

Discovery is the Junior school stage of our Stepping Stones and Gateway programmes, designed to enable all our pupils to become **confident**, **connected communicators** with the skills and understanding they need to excel in their chosen field.



In Discovery, pupils learn collaboratively and expand their understanding of themselves, their community, and their world. Projects include 'My World of Work,' 'Technology Time,' and 'Whatever the Weather!' In drama and music, all pupils take part in the **annual Nativity play**, as well as **singing** at local care homes and at **school events**.



Junior 6 and 7 Masterclass Afternoons

Junior 6 and Junior 7 have **Masterclass afternoons**, 3 - 4 days a week, where they receive subject specialist tuition, preparing them for subjects in senior school and inspiring a wide enjoyment of academic subjects.

PE

Pupils have a weekly sports coaching session and a varied programme of other activities throughout the year, including skiing, swimming, and gymnastics.

Gaining their full potential

We structure these years in a way that allowsour pupils to thrive. We understand that the Senior School phase can be challenging. We do everything we can to make these years successful, happy ones for each pupil. We ensure they have opportunity to develop the skills, connections, and sense of personal responsibility they need to achieve their potential in school and beyond.

Pupil wellbeing and Guidance

Weekly Health and Wellbeing sessions focus on building resilience, improving wellbeing, promoting positive behaviour and teaching strategies for positive mental wellbeing. Our pastoral system is a core strength of Cedars School, and we find the ethos of the school, makes a lasting input on the quality of friendships within the school, and in life after school.



Responsibility and Opportunities

Senior School pupils enjoy opportunities to become involved in the wider life of the school and gain an increasing sense of responsibility that comes with these. They are involved in running the Senior school extra-curricular clubs and play a significant role in the Pupil Council.

Athletic achievement

In PE we encourage good natured competition. We run an Award Scheme called Athlete of the Day and Athlete of the Term. Externally we join with other schools and take part in events such as Inverclyde Warrior and Inverclyde Schools Cross Country Competition. Pupil know the local sports facilities well and we enjoy good links with sporting teams across Inverclyde and Renfrewshire. We encourage all pupils to establish healthy routines and support pupils looking for extra - curricular activities.

Tailor-made academic pathways - success for all

National Courses

Pupils undertake courses leading to qualifications at National 3, 4 & 5, Higher and Advanced Higher level. Pupils select from subjects including:

- Art & Design
- Biology
- Business Management
- Chemistry
- English
- French
- History
- Maths
- Modern Studies
- Physics
- Scottish Studies

Study techniques

Senior School pupils are supported in this time of transition with input on study techniques.

Academic responsibility

Alongside their studies pupils deepen their sense of personal responsibility for their own lives and for helping others, and work alongside teachers and members of the professional community to understand the best pathway for them as they plan for life after school.

Broadening opportunities

Our link with West College Scotland provides increased opportunities for further vocational and academic study. Subjects currently studied by Cedars pupils include: Higher Psychology, N4 and N5 Criminology, Data Science, Film and TV Studies.

In S6, some students take courses with the Young Applicants in Schools Scheme. YASS is a school-based programme run through the Open University in Scotland. These courses allow students to study a subject of particular interest at a preparatory level for university. We also work with Scottish Highers Online to offer Advanced Highers in a range of subjects.

We believe children and young people learn as much outside the classroom as they do inside it. The co-curriculum at Cedars School builds resilience, improves self-discipline, and teaches the skills required to work effectively as part of a team.

Our pastoral system helps pupils learn to be reflective about themselves and their experiences with the aim of understanding how they might improve, which helps to build self-reliance and a sense of personal responsibility. Each pupil has a *Learner Journal* where they record and reflect on co – curricular experiences. Our small class sizes mean pupils develop friendships across the age groups making for a richer peer group environment. We build on this with opportunities for co – curricular activities across age groups. Senior School pupils enjoy leading learning opportunities in the Junior School.

Just as importantly, our aim in our co – curricular programme is to ensure our children and young people take part in activities that provide fun and enjoyment – so important in an increasingly stress-driven world.

The Cedars Difference Stepping Stones Senior 1 - Senior 4

Learn today, lead tomorrow.

Stepping Stones is a core element of our approach to ensuring a well-rounded, whole-person educational experience in Senior School. One afternoon a week, pupils engage with visits from guest speakers, links with Skills Development Scotland, input from a variety of staff, and offsite visits. Pupils develop the skills and knowledge they need to take personal responsibility for leading a purposeful, compassionate, healthy life. They develop their understanding of themselves, the world around them, the needs of others, and how they can be outward looking, as they prepare for the future.

In recent months pupils have:

- Undertaken survival skills in the countryside around Greenock.
- Completed First Aid training with St Andrews.
- Heard from business owners on core skills in enterprise.
- Listened to former pupils speak on their experiences at various institutions including: City of Glasgow College, Oxford University, University of Glasgow, West College Scotland and Glasgow School of Art.
- Had a visit from a reformed drug addict from The Haven in Kilmacolm
- Completed CAP Money Course training, teaching them about banks accounts, debit and credit, mortgages, savings accounts.
- Experienced podcast training with Colin Kelly of Comsteria.
- Heard from international award-winning photographer Paul Thorburn about the challenges and opportunities in creative industries.
- Enjoyed visits from charities including Mary's Meals, Street Connect, Teen Challenge Strathclyde, Aid for Education, Refuweegee and Man on Inverclyde.
- Met with professionals including: our local Sheriff, a GP, Physiotherapists, a Psychologist, a Solicitor, Pharmacist, Engineer, Marine Biologist, Police Officer.
- Enjoyed theatre trips to see Charlie and the Chocolate Factory, the Lion King, and An Inspector Calls.

Confident, connected communicators

All Senior 5 students are invited to to join Gateway – our dynamic programme in which students encounter new experiences and opportunities that give them the tools to become confident communicators with established connections in the wider community and professional sphere. Feedback from former pupils indicates the significance of the connections and confidence gained during the Gateway programme.

Students:

- Are assigned a personal success mentor from the world of work who will offer advice, insight and accountability.
- Establish and develop their own network with a variety of professionals at termly dinners and in school events.
- Develop critical skills for higher or further education, employment or training including termly practice interviews with local professionals.
- Participate in culturally enriching opportunities to develop confidence as global citizens, such as theatre and music trips, city tours, university open days and museum visits.
- Are given lifetime membership of Cedars School Society, our network of Alumni and professionals who support one another and our school.

Gateway Leadership Academy

Senior 6 students are invited to join the **Leadership Academy** – a unique year of challenges that build on their Gateway experiences. Recent students have completed public speaking engagements within and outside of school, led initiatives within the school to raise money for charity, and pioneered mentoring of younger pupils.

The Cedars Difference Reading School

We are an accredited 'Reading School' with the Scottish Book Trust.

We are a school of Readers – reading is a core part of educational and co – curricular programmes.

Pupils love the cosy and inviting **Reading Corner** in our library and each Junior class creates their own Reading Corners. Pupils from J1 – S6 are involved in our Reading Leaders council meetings, while staff, pupils and members of the school community share their latest 'Good Reads' on our Reading Wall in the school foyer.

Monthly reading challenges encourage students to broaden their reading horizons, and provide opportunities to respond creatively to a text, build their vocabulary, review books for their class, @cedarsreaders on Instagram, and win house points. We host **local authors** and **bookshop owners**, and celebrate World Book Day each year – see our exciting costumes on Instagram!










The Cedars Difference Outdoor Education and Day Trips

Since our establishment in 1999, we have recognised the great value of outdoor education and visits to cultural sites. These experiences are a source of enjoyment, an opportunity to hone life skills. to connect with and and understand nature and the environment. They are а wav physical providing and mental challenges, and allow pupils to learn and resilience skills to overcome setbacks.



Recent trips across our Junior and Senior School include:

- Biology trip to the Millport Field Station
- · Christmas Markets in Glasgow
- Walking History tour of Edinburgh
- Treezone at Loch Lomond

- Kelvingrove Museum and Art Gallery
- Boat trip on the Clyde to see the Sugar Boat
- Mount Stuart House on the Isle of Bute
- Helping the community through volunteering afternoons at Wellington Street allotments.



Residential trips are a key feature of life at Cedars, we are often told by former pupils just how significant these trips have been.

On residentials, friendships are formed and pupils enjoy experiences not normally available in day-to-day life. They build their understanding of the world and their place in it, and will often revisit places they have seen with their families or with friends in post school life.

Past trips include Compass Outdoor Activities Centre, Aviemore, Edinburgh, York, London, Florence, the Battlefields of World War 1 in Belgium and France, and working with a local charity in Rwanda.

In April 2024, our Junior 6 and 7s enjoyed an exciting five-day trip to **Northumberland**. Visits included Durham cathedral, Beamish living museum, a forest adventure day, a farm experience (where they saw a lamb being born!), Hadrian's Wall, and much more.

In June 2024, Senior 1 to Senior 6 are going to Paris for a week – we can't wait! We will visit famous landmarks, a beautiful chateau, Disneyland – and more.
